As Presidents of the Association of Former New Jersey State Troopers and the New Jersey Retired Police and Firemen's Association, we are privileged to represent and extend our thanks and support to New Jersey's public employees, especially our law enforcement, fire service, and first responder community, both active and retired. Together, we furnish this letter in support of the candidacy of Mr. Jack Ciattarelli as the next Governor of New Jersey, for the following reasons.
