

JOSEPH M. GETSINGER - Artist



In 1980 he created the first fundraiser image for the Burn Foundation titled, "Night Call," and has continued supporting them for the last 38 years raising funds for burn victims/survivors. This artist has created over 250 separate limited edition prints and continues painting in his studio in Woodbury Heights, New Jersey.
